

Tonight I am sitting in my living room at my small work table eating my very abstinent meal. My husband is out of town on a business trip; he has been gone for three days. Seven years ago my evenings during his absence would have been very different: I would have been driving in my car to my various favorite eating spots, pretending to the service people that I was preparing for a very large party. I'm sure I fooled no one and also sure no one cared. At home, I feasted alone at the "large party." Today I am no longer obsessed with food. Today I have Overeaters Anonymous on my side along with a loving, no-nonsense sponsor, really wonderful OA friends and a God of my understanding who has guided me along this new path. I have abstinently survived the passing of my father and the death of my brother with not one binge.



When I entered my first OA meeting, I was angry because I was there, afraid that I would be judged, and surprised at the things I heard: hope, success, humor, and yes, maybe more importantly, honesty about food struggles. Folks were speaking openly about their relationship with both food and people. It was weeks before I would open my mouth and when I did, there was no judgment, only members nodding in understanding.

I love the fourth step: "Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves."

Previously, in my life others were to blame for everything that wasn't perfect: "Poor Me!" So my fourth step inventory was long. But it has led me to a much clearer understanding of my role in my life. Thank you OA and all my OA friends.



- **Sponsorship** is a spiritual relationship based on **E**quality, **A**nonymity and **T**rust. **EAT**
- **Sponsorship** is a spiritual relationship with no strings attached.
- **Sponsorship** has no pedestal, no degree, cap or gown, no tiara and no magic wand.
- **Sponsorship** is an opportunity to grow and recover together, not in isolation. Isolation begets insanity .
- **Sponsorship** keeps me focused and allows me to be of service as I share what has been given me.
- **Sponsorship** helps me see what works for me.
- **Sponsors** are abstinent members using the tools, steps and principles of our program.
- **Sponsors** are not responsible for another's abstinence
- **Sponsors** set health boundaries.
- **Sponsors** are not therapists.
- **Sponsees** are encouraged to build a network of trusted friends in recovery.
- **Sponsees** honor commitments.
